

Sunday 1 December 2024 7.30 pm




From a shrine in the Šumava Forest, Czechia

Marc-Antoine Charpentier's Messe de Minuit from 1694 sets the Latin texts to traditional folk carol melodies, while Edmund Pascha's Pastoral Mass from the 1770s inserts the Christmas Story sung in English. Despite facing racial prejudice, Coleridge-Taylor's settings of Longfellow's epic poem became hugely popular when written at the very end of the 19th century.

The concert begins with the best known, Hiawatha's Wedding Feast.

The other Englishmen abroad are Elgar with his Songs from the Bavarian Highlands and Parry, whose magnificent Blest Pair of Sirens sets John Milton's poem At a Solemn Music. The Choir is accompanied by Rosalind Hall piano.
